
The Bodhi seal of the Patriarchs



THIRTY-SIXTH GENERATION DHYANA MASTER PU YUAN (UNIVERSAL VOWS) OF NAN QUAN (SOUTHERN SPRINGS REGION)

The Master's surname was Wang. He was a native of Hsin Cheng. He received the bequest from Dhyana Master Ta Wei (Great Wisdom), and went to the Lofty Peak to receive the precepts and practice the different sections of the Vinaya. Later he bowed to the Patriarch Ma Tzu. Instantaneously he let loose his grip on things and attained the Playful Roaming Samadhi. One day as they were passing gruel in the dining hall, Ma Tzu asked, "What is inside this bucket?"

The Master replied, "What is the old guy rambling about?" Whereupon the Patriarch ceased talking.

During the Cheng Yuan reign period (785-805 A.D.) of the T'ang Dynasty, the Master rested at Ch'ih Chou and did not go down to the Southern Springs region for well over thirty years. One day, the leader of the assembly asked him, "In a hundred year's time, where will the Venerable Master go?"
