#151. Commander Ken Ywan Destroys Buddhist Temples



The *Shin Hai* Revolution started in 1911, and the last Manchu Emperor, Sywan Tung, abdicated the throne. Everywhere monasteries and temples were laid waste, images were destroyed, and members of the Sangha were expelled. The Yunnan Provincial Commander, Li Ken Ywan, led his infantry troops in the destruction of monasteries and statues, murdering bhikshus and butchering bhikshunis. That the Master, a poor monk, could profoundly win the heart of the common multitude and be venerated and protected by them, seemed very strange. Therefore, Commander Li ordered his arrest. A catastrophe was imminent—dangerous indeed!
