在學業上的成就讓我進入極好的大學 和研究所,這些是人生重要的一部分。在 《華嚴經》十地品第五難勝地中,金剛藏 菩薩用偈頌描述五地菩薩的修行境界說:

爲欲教化諸世間	善知書數印等法
亦復善解諸方藥	療治眾病悉令癒
文辭歌舞皆巧妙	宮宅園池悉安隱
寶藏非一咸示人	利益無量眾生故
日月星宿地震動	乃至身相亦觀察
四禪無色及神通	爲益世間皆顯示

Every decision that one makes (and does not make) in life is important. However, if I had to choose one that was more significant than any other, I would go with my decision to come and study at Developing Virtue School at the City of Ten Thousand Buddhas.

I have benefited in a multitude of ways from my experience at Developing Virtue School (DVS) and learned countless precious lessons. The experience was unique because there were many living examples of people who tirelessly practice in order to uncover their inherent wisdom, and I learn these lessons by observing and emulating them. The most important things I took away from my experiences there (more important than the academic training) was a good foundation in my spiritual practices, especially those of holding precepts and meditation.

The practice of meditation gives me the freedom and mental space to examine my intentions and act mindfully and spontaneously; holding the precepts gives me the clarity at moments when insight is lacking. These two jointly provide me the stillness so I can live my life freely, purposefully, and with strength. Without them I will invariably forget what I have done, be confused about why my life is the way it is, feel frustrated about not being able to change it because I don't remember what I did. I will further repeat all of my past mistake in perpetuity.

The academic training I received which led to educational opportunities at a good university and later graduate school is an important piece of the puzzle as well. In a verse describing the fifth ground of a Bodhisattva, or an enlightened being, in the Ten Grounds Chapter of *Avatamsaka Sutra* (which is a major scripture in our tradition), a Bodhisattva by the name of Vajra Treasury said:

In order to mature people, the Bodhisattvas establish arts and skills--Writing, printing, mathematics, medical sciences, exorcism, antidotes, and curing, Establishing excellent education, compassionate, kind, intelligent. Witty in the finest song and dance, they build delightful places--Canals, parks with flowers and fruits, places to sit, Doing many things for the joy of beings,

Even revealing many kinds of treasure troves.

Mastering observation of the movements of celestial bodies and earth As well as physiognomy,

They accomplish formless meditations, mystic knowledge, and the immeasurables,

Desiring well-being and happiness for the world.

It is in this spirit of benefiting others that we do our best to learn. It is in this spirit that we attach importance to learning our subjects and excel in our studies. The school offers an unique environment where both spiritual and academic learning are emphasized and integrated into a larger picture. I benefited greatly, and wish that more people could have the same opportunity.
