Pang, Pai-kuong (Kuo Kuong) was born in Jerantut, Pahang, Malaysia on May 30, 1955. His younger brother died at the age of thirteen and his mother died when Kuo Kuong was only nine years old. As a young lad, Kuo Kuong remembers working in the family-owned rubber business collecting laytex as it flowed from the trees in the early morning before school.

After Kuo Kuong completed his high school education, he attended Vanto Academy where he studied accounting. After that, he got a job at Lai Dan Rakan-Rakan, an accounting firm, and worked there for six and one half years.

Kuo Kuong had first begun to believe in the Buddhadharma in 1980, when he attended the opening of the Wisdom Buddhist Temple in Kuala Lumpur. At that time he read the *Heart Sutra* and the *Vajra Sutra* and felt that the Buddha's Way was the way to follow in order to find the answers in his quest for the meaning of life. Later Kuo Kuong saw the Venerable Master Hua at Wisma Buddhist Temple and he was moved to take refuge and to receive the Five Precepts. Kuo Kuong says about taking refuge, "I had read the Venerable Abbot's biography and knew that he is someone we can truly rely on. Upon hearing his lectures, I felt that they were true and to the point."
