He got out of bed and fired up the stove. Then he took his mat, bedding, and clothes and put them in the pot inside the steamer. The whole night long he was extremely nervous and unable to rest peacefully.

The following day as he was relating to a neighbor the story of what had happened the previous night, right in the middle of the conversation he suddenly became extremely tense and said, "The frogs are all over my body again!" His neighbor looked, but could not see any frogs. A moment later, Lyang Jya-shou said, "The frogs are all through my hair and eyebrows!" Then he completely shaved off the hair on his head, brows, and beard. But it didn't change the way he felt. Every day he had his son-in-law beat his body with a board. And that wasn't all.
